Killer sentenced

Executed neighbour over barking dog

A killer who murdered his neighbour over a barking dog will serve 17 years in prison.

The violent 64-year-old was found guilty of shooting his neighbour with a handgun before firing several shots at the victim's family as they rushed him to hospital.

The defendant, identified only as JGM, confronted his neighbour over the barking of his dog at his rural estate near El Ejido. A fight broke out between the men during which JGM whipped out his illegally owned handgun and shot his neighbour in the left arm.

His victim attempted to flee into the garage but was tracked by his assailant, who fired another bullet into his chest. The victim's wife desperately tried to stop the second shot but was punched and forced out of the way.

After the shooting a friend of the victim's family arrived on scene. He and the man's wife put him in the car and sped off to the hospital. The killer fired a volley of 12 bullets at the car, striking the driver in the arm.



THE CASE was heard at Almería's Provincial Court.

Fortunately the driver escaped serious injury, but suffered post traumatic stress disorder and severe anxiety. The victim died of organ failure at the hospital.

Judges at Almería's Provincial Court imposed a 10-year sentence

for the murder, with an extra six years for attempted murder and one year for owning an illegal weapon. The killer has been ordered to pay €34,000 compensation to the driver and €100,000 to the family of his victim.



Wanted: Dead or Alive

LA GRECORIA, an Almería pub, is taking full advantage of the arrival of Hollywood royalty to Almería. The city bar is offering a free bottle of Jim Beam bourbon to anyone who manages to somehow drag either Jake Gyllenhaal or Joaquin Phoenix along for a visit.

Creative barmen have even drawn up two Wild West themed posters with portraits of the two leading men above the classic slogan Wanted: Dead or Alive. Although presumably alive would be better for business.

The owners describe their challenge as "but not impossible" and believe at least one plucky Almerician will be able to pull it off.

The American stars are in Almería filming the new Jacques Audiard film Les Freres Sisters. The film is set in the American Old West and the Tabernas Desert is providing much of the

scenery.

Spain's only desert has been the backdrop to several Western classics, including Sergio Leone's Spaghetti Western trilogy.

Boogie Nights star John C Reilly is also in Almería filming with Phoenix and Gyllenhaal in what is one of the biggest films in years to be shot in the province.

Concern over escalation in refugees

OVER the weekend at least 80 people were rescued from four boats by Salvamento Maritime officers and the Guardia Civil. All four boats were discovered just off the coast of Almería. Three contained roughly two dozen sub-Saharan Africans. One carried eight Algerians.

There were just three women and two children among the 80 migrants. All were saved before their boats capsized and are in good health. The men have been transferred to a detention facility. The eight Algerian men, who got as far as Carboneras, face immediate deportation.

With an average of 40 per day, albeit over a two-day period, the rescues highlight the quick escalation of the people smuggling trade. Only a few years ago 80 would represent an annual, rather than weekend, total.

Feeling appy

NIJAR Council is upping the ante ahead of the peak summer season by updating and improving its tourist app, with the addition of new features and businesses, including a daily news service. The app is available as a free download by searching 'Nijar App' on Google Play or the iTunes App Store.

Death from above

A NEW weapon in the war against mosquitoes has been unleashed by Vera Council after fumigators took to the skies in a helicopter to spray hotspots using a new biocide based on a bacteria that is harmless to plants and animals but attacks the digestive systems of mosquito larvae.

Special guests

DESTINATION Costa de Almeria has launched its latest summer campaign bringing more than 40,000 tourists from 10 different European countries on 17 new flights. The campaign is distinct from regular tourism in that these guests have been targeted during specific giveaways, competitions, and advertising in their home countries.

Safety risk

SPANISH FACTS OF LIFE... 16

From jumping through bonfires to hurling dead rats at fellow revellers, Spanish culture is awash with quirky traditions, none more so than El Salto del Colacho, the annual baby jumping festival which takes place this Sunday.

Look away, Mum!

HELD in the village of Castrillo de Murcia near Burgos in northern Spain, El Salto del Colacho most closely translates as the Devil's leap.

During the celebrations, babies born within the previous 12 months are laid on mattresses in the street before men dressed as the Devil in red and yellow costumes take turns to leap over them.


Normally taking place on the Sunday after the Catholic feast of Corpus Christi, baby jumping is a traditional practice dating back to the early 1600s.

The infants are placed in rows before the devils, who also sport grotesque face masks, make their way through the crowd, whipping bystanders before careering over the

helpless children.

As they do so, the babies are said to be blessed and cleansed of original sin before being sprinkled with rose petals and recovered by relieved parents.

Although it might seem dangerous, there are no reports of injuries or fatalities during the event, although it is frowned upon by the Catholic Church, with news reports in 2012 suggesting that Pope Benedict himself encouraged the Spanish clergy to distance themselves from it.




DEVIL: Jumps over the babies.

Speak of the devil

EL COLACHO is organised by the shadowy, black-clad Brotherhood of Santisimo Sacramento de Minerva, members of which dress up as both the devil and his companion the Atabalero, or drummer.

The devils clutch percussion instruments known as castanets while the top hat and tailcoated Atabaleros beat drums in unison as they run through the town's streets.

Festivities begin on the Wednesday preceding the event with daily processions during which the devils also chase cheeky adults and children, ter-



rorising and hitting them gently with horse-tail whips.

Each Devil is followed by two rows of the brotherhood and the group makes its way to the church, where an entrance ritual is performed.

All members remove their hats and bow in greeting as the Devil and Atabalero arrive, the former removing his mask before heading to the sanctuary where both remain during mass.

Twin Parks

CELEBRATING its 30th birthday, Sierra Maria-Los Velez national park in Almeria, twinned for the day with Altmühl Park in Bavaria. Similar activities were undertaken in both parks to promote environmental awareness and expressions of support and congratulations were exchanged.

Protecting police

THE council in Carboneras has a policy of protecting its 17-strong Local Police force and has given bullet proof vests reportedly at a cost of €10,000. It is also looking to purchase a new police car and moving their headquarters.

Brit invasion

PASSENGER numbers at Almeria airport shot up by 18.5 per cent in May to reach 102,482. British tourist numbers rose the most as the airport braces for a record breaking year.

Go West

A NEW western, The Sisters Brothers, starring Jake Gyllenhaal, Joaquin Phoenix and John C Reilly will be filmed over four weeks across Almeria. Filming will then move to other parts of Spain.

Violent dirty dozen detained

A DANGEROUS criminal gang described by police as "violent and unpredictable" were dismantled in an extensive joint operation across Almeria.

A dozen members of the gang were arrested by National Police and Guardia Civil at various addresses across the province. They are suspected of committing at least 30 armed robberies of shops in both Almeria and Granada.

Targets included jewellers in Dalias, Pulpi and Berja, where they used hammers to smash through

the windows of an establishment and steal €12,000 of gems and gold. They frequently used stolen cars to smash through security gates.

Police eventually tracked the gang to the small town of Albunol, Granada and caught them in the act of another armed robbery. Those arrested gave up key details allowing police to make further arrests in Almeria. Their base of operations was in El Ejido and all 12 members of the gang are believed to be Romanian.



Hate crimes shoot up

HATE crimes increased in Almeria last year, bucking a nationwide trend that saw a general decline in attacks against minority groups. Though they rose, Almeria's figures are still low. The province accounted for just 15 of Spain's 1,272 reported hate crimes.

Offences are registered as hate crimes if victims are targeted on the basis of their race, religion, nationality, disability or sexual identity. Attacks on the homeless can also be designated as hate crimes.

Almeria differs slightly from Spain with attacks on members of the gay community not being included in the official stats. The European Union also estimates around eight in 10 hate crimes go unreported as victims, especially immigrants, have a fear of going to police.

In Almeria's case the majority of the 15 formal hate crimes were attacks on eight disabled victims. Another five were against foreign nationals and registered as racism. There was also one anti-Semitic attack.

OUR VIEW

Surprise result raises questions

THERE is little doubt that the Conservative party was caught by surprise by the seemingly disastrous result of the General Election.

The powers behind the throne, the two advisors to Mrs May, Nick Timothy and Fiona Hill resigned almost immediately and now the Prime Minister appears to be trying to carry on as if nothing too untoward has happened.

Her cabinet remains broadly as it was prior to the election, although another Brexiteer Michael Gove returns as environment secretary and will be responsible for reviewing agricultural support following Britain's exit from the EU.

The loss of an overall majority will make it more difficult to enter Brexit negotiations when the EU knows that the prime minister has made a major error of judgement by getting the mood of the nation so wrong.

She said she would use the anticipated increased majority to strengthen her hand with Europe and instead has to keep power by putting together an unlikely and possibly unstable pact with the Democratic Unionist Party which has already caused negative comments from the Republic of Ireland.

Assuming she is not voted out as Tory leader, it is possible Mrs May will have to be a little less hard line in her negotiations with Brussels than she had originally hoped.



RECENTLY opened tourist information points across Nijar are already at full capacity. Throngs of tourists, both local and international have used the facilities since they opened on June 1.

There is now talk of extending opening hours and dates at three tourist centres in Agua-marga, San Jose and Las Negras. The Villa de Nijar is open year round but may also get extended hours.

Tourism and Beaches councillor Alexis Pineda has stressed that safety is paramount as beaches, boardwalks, public toilets, and



Blitz shelters to be salvaged in city

COMPLEX architectural work is being carried out to conserve Almería's air raid shelters and Civil War defence fortifications. The expansive work comes as several sites scattered throughout the city expect to be declared national areas of cultural interest.

“Tunnels and shelters were built in the Spanish Civil War.

Their new status affords them greater legal protection. Labourers and architects are now working under the guidance of expert historians who are deeply familiar with the precarious bunkers, trenches and shelters that have survived the past 80 years.

The historians want all of Almería's defences to be included collectively as one large site of cultural interest, rather than dozens of smaller sites. The conservation work will attempt to link the sites, if not physically then by helping create an overarching narrative.

The ambitious plans aren't limited solely to the city. There are an estimated 56 defensive fortifications dotted around the province that architects want to protect.

Other areas include Mojacar, Benahadux, Nijar, Car-

boneras and Cuevas del Almanzora.

There are a total of 25 bunkers in the city, 15 trenches, nine bomb shelters and three bases which are in surprisingly good condition and expected to receive more funding for protection.

Miles of underground tunnels and shelters were built in Almería at the height of the Spanish Civil War. During the Nazi bombardment of the city in 1937 an estimated 40,000 civilians took shelter underground as almost 1,000 bombs were dropped.

First Spaniard in space in Almeria

SPAIN'S first ever astronaut visited Almeria to attend the province's sixth Astronomical Conference and receive an honorary doctorate from the University.

Speaking at the conference at the Maestro Padilla auditorium, Pedro Duque revealed how Almeria plays a key role in astronomy and space exploration today. The 54-year-old, who visited the International Space Station in 2003, is one of Spain's foremost solar system authorities.

He told a stunned audience that the brightness of the artificial farms in the greenhouses of Aguadulce, known as the plastic sea, are one of the only parts of Spain visible from space.

A combination of the cleanest skies in Europe and the thriving agriculture landscape puts Almeria on a par with the

Great Wall of China for visibility.

Duque also praised scientists in the Tabernas Desert who are developing a new system of extracting oxygen from sand using concentrated solar energy. The technology could someday be used to help generate more oxygen for human explorers on the lunar surface.

Duque, whose maiden voy-

age was aboard the STS-95 1998 launch from the Kennedy Space Centre, took time to visit the acclaimed Photography Exhibition of the Universe at the entrance to the province's presidential palace.

Duque wrote in the visitor's book that the view from Almeria is even greater than the view from space thanks to its people, joy and light.





Workshops have already begun in Mojacar, Sorbas and Olula del Rio.



Beating the heat

A SPECIAL plan is in place to protect residents across the province from the harmful effects of excessive temperatures this summer.

The Junta de Andalucía's prevention plan will focus on some of Almería's most vulnerable groups, including the elderly, children,

labourers and those with mental disabilities.

Health and social workers will work with volunteer teams to monitor at-risk populations. They will make sure they either wear protection or stay out of the sun during the hottest hours of the day.

The biggest threat isn't dangerous sun rays but skyrocketing temperatures that can cause or seriously affect medical conditions, or even change how the body interacts with certain medications.

Risk of heart failure and stroke is more pronounced during summer, especially for those suffering from obesity, diabetes or hypertension. Home visits will be organised to ensure vulner-

able people are not exposed to extreme heat or humidity inside.

Last year's campaign saw almost 1,000 people visited by health response officials. This year, hundreds more will also receive phone calls to check in on them.

An awareness campaign is set to be rolled out by the ministry of health offering advice on protection from the heat.

Entitled Verano 2017: Cuidados frente al calor (Summer 2017: Care against heat), is available online and can be downloaded to phones.

Advice includes wearing light clothing and hats, ventilating rooms, lowering blinds and closing doors during the afternoon, drink-

ing plenty of water and avoiding strenuous day-time exercises.

The Health Responder mobile phone app has been downloaded 1.6 million times across Andalucía. It alerts users when outside temperatures are dangerously high and advises on how to deal with sun stroke.

The summer campaign will also offer free advice

on avoiding mosquito stings, insect bites, and unhygienic food and drink. A variety of air and water-borne viruses sent dozens of people to hospital last year.

Daily alert levels will be posted online. Green indicates normal temperatures, while yellow and orange suggest exercising care. Take extra precautions during the maximum red alert.



Blueprints for the ambitious project at Lake Baikal include tusks 100 metres long which will hold conference centres.

Buryatia president Alexey Tsydenov reckons the skull-shaped hotel will become a lucrative tourist attraction.

Black gold

■ A DEAL was struck between Russian and Iran to import 100,000 barrels of Iranian oil per day.

The countries forged a stronger partnership when Iranian president Rouhani visited Moscow in March.

He spoke with President Putin about establishing a free trade zone including Russia, Iran, Kazakhstan and Armenia.

Party massacre

■ A DINNER party became a bloodbath when a 45-year-old electrician shot dead nine companions. Sergei Yegorov was drunk and outraged that guests didn't believe he was once a paratrooper. He left to fetch a rifle and returned screaming "Now I'll show you that I can shoot."

Missing summer

■ AN unusually cold start to Russia's summer was jokingly blamed on the Americans pulling out of the Paris climate accord.

Chilly temperatures are causing food prices to rise due to higher than expected transportation costs.

The Central Bank warned that a cold 2017 might even trigger higher inflation rates.

but already four health authorities around Spain have been criticised by their own employees for accepting donations estimated at €17 million each, with staff saying that health funding is the job

of government not an individual.

One medical professional even went so far as to suggest that it would be more appropriate for Mr Ortega to spend his money making life better for his employees

and those producing his stock in Asia rather than meddling in what is a matter for the government to deal with.

His donations have been used to buy mammogram and radiography machinery as well as for investigation into the causes of cancer.

If this was a 'simple' illness, easily cured, the position of medical practitioners would be more easily understood say cancer charities, but any advance in treatment doesn't just help Spain but sufferers all over the world.

Liberbank suffers on stock exchange

SET up in 2011 after the amalgamation of three savings banks, Liberbank which employs 4,850 has seen a drop in share value.

The sudden sale of Banco Popular seems to have caused a backlash for this supposedly vulnerable bank, with its shares dropping well below the €1 mark.

In a bid to show support for the bank, major shareholders have been purchasing the cheaper shares and are attempting to push the price back up as with assets of more than €38 billion and a 2016 profit of €128 million, they do not consider it to be a risky investment.

Everything will be applied for, approved and distributed online without the need to provide any paper documentation and loans for periods of up to three years at interest rates in the region of 16.5 per cent, will if approved, be transferred to bank accounts within 48 hours.

The company arranging the loan, Telefonica Consumer Finance, is part owned by Caixa Bank, one of Telefonica's largest shareholders.

Catalonian economy plans

DESPITE the fact that the Catalonian government plans to hold an Independence Referendum, the Spanish government has just approved loans of €5.3 billion until September.

Whilst much is made of the value of the Cat-

Old British fivers now out of circulation

MORE than £150 million (€177m) in old British five pound notes officially withdrawn from circulation have still not been handed in.

Some of the old fivers now worthless when shopping are undoubtedly still held by British expats living in Spain, according to one banking source.

“We are not exchanging the notes here as they are no longer officially legal tender” the Costa del Sol based money man said.

However, he claimed that some of the old-style cotton-paper notes not handed in before the final deadline ahead of the more modern and new notes will still be in wallets and travel bags used only by expatriates when travelling back to the UK.

“We all do it, putting notes aside when we return from a trip to the UK, and we only look at the money when we next travel. In some cases the trips can be a year apart meaning many expats probably have some - and perhaps in certain cases many - worthless fivers in wallets and purses used when travelling.”

The Bank of England in London is legally obliged to encash the old notes - taken out of circulation from midnight Friday May 5 - when handed over the counter in person.

Expats not travelling to the UK can post the old five pound notes directly to the Bank of England.

But when posted this action is done at ‘sender’s risk.’

If the amount of old fivers is viewed as large, identification may also be sought.

Additionally banks, building societies as well as post offices

throughout the UK are still accepting them, but only in person, with many seeking an explanation as to the source and reason they were not handed in before they went out of circulation.

There are even online companies who will purchase these and other withdrawn notes at 92 per cent of face value.

BANCO POPULAR SOLD FOR €1

The story behind the sale

IN what was something of a surprise announcement, Banco Santander Group Executive Chairman, Ana Botín announced that the Bank had paid €1 for Banco Popular.

According to her, this now makes Santander the largest bank in Spain and one of the largest in the world although existing shareholders in Popular are likely to lose their entire investment.

The acquisition was completed following an auction conducted by the Single Resolution Board and FROB in which Santander was selected as the successful bidder, paying a notional consideration of €1.

As part of the transaction Santander will complete a rights issue for a total amount of €7 billion in order to cover provisions in Popular’s balance sheet caused in the main by bad property debts.

It is reported that quite substantial investments in the failing Banks had been made from South America recently and these investors together with an estimated 300,000 disap-

pointed shareholders will only be offered the opportunity to have preferential rights to purchase new Santander shares although there are rumours of legal action.

The Governor of the Bank of Spain Luis Linde declined to make any statement about Banco Popular when he appeared before a Senate Budget Committee saying that he was unprepared for the question and Ana Botín reportedly denied that Santander had been put under any government pressure to take over Popular.

Popular will be brought under the Santander umbrella in Spain and

Santander Totta in Portugal and the combined operation will promote vital SME lending - loans to small and medium sized companies - in Spain fuelled by the recovery of the economy and expects to hold 25 per cent of the entire market.

Although there will be the need to write down part of the value of the Popular balance sheet, Santander expects to reduce the number of bad debts and properties quickly so that it forecasts a return on investment of 13 to 14 per cent by 2020 and an overall cost reduction of €500 million by the same year.

The combined entity will be led by the current management team of Santander Spain with Rami Aboukhair as CEO.

“We welcome Banco Popular customers as part of the Santander Group and will work hard to continue serving them at the highest standards through the transition and beyond” said Ana Botín when making the announcement of the takeover.

Chinese emporiums investigated by tax office

THE Spanish Tax Agency is targeting Chinese-owned companies in Spain which it suspects may be importing or selling goods without paying tax.

More than 300 officials have been tasked with visiting 60 warehouses of wholesalers in 11 different provinces including Elche and Madrid in order to audit books and identify possible evasion.

This is one of a number of regular investigations into Chinese entrepreneurs who have opened wholesale operations and shops in numerous towns and cities throughout Spain thanks to earlier financial incentives from the government.

Similar actions have taken place in recent years and resulted in the discovery that up to €100 million of unpaid or evaded tax existed.

Gibraltar’s cybersecurity

IT is particularly appropriate that following the massive disruption by the Wannacry hacking that Gibraltar should have hosted its first Cybersecurity conference.

Organised in association with the Royal Gibraltar Police, this event was particularly important to hold in Gibraltar with its many internet betting companies and new tenants in the recently opened World Trade Centre, all of whom are potentially vulnerable to disruption.

Expert speakers arrived on board the Sunborn Yacht Hotel to warn delegates about the dangers of cyber-attack and the way to protect their companies.

Later in the day, the event was opened to the general public and their families in order to pass on tips and advice to consumers who can also be vulnerable to cyber-infection.

SPANISH COMPANY FIGHTS FOR ITS LIFE

Fallout from Banco Popular sale

JUST one year away from the 160th anniversary of its founding, industrial company Duro Felguera must be wondering if it will last that long.

Shares in the company which specialises in the implementation of turnkey projects for the energy and industrial sectors, as well as the manufacturing of goods lost 26 per cent in one day, following the sale of Banco Popular to Banco Santander and in four years its value has fallen by €800 million.

The problem for the company is that it has very large borrowings which it is having difficulty in refinancing, so shareholders fear that now with a worth of less than €100 million that it could fail or could be vulnerable to an aggressive take-over.

This company faces a typical dilemma as it appears to be quite adept at obtaining new business but it is burdened with so much accumulated debt that

it may find the rush to sell its shares may either bring it down or frighten off new potential clients.

The fact that shareholders in Banco Popular may receive next to nothing for their shares after acquisition of the bank by Santander for €1 is driving small investors to desert this and other vulnerable companies following what is being called 'Black Wednesday' in the Spanish financial press.

2012 tax concession unlawful

ALTHOUGH it will not affect retrospectively anyone who took advantage of the 2012 Spanish tax amnesty, the Constitutional Court has upheld complaints that it was unconstitutional.

The matter was laid before the court by some 50 delegates of the PSOE political party who argued that it was an abuse of the constitution to allow some high earning tax payers to pay just 10 per cent of outstanding tax over €100,000.

According to the complainants, those who were honest and paid their taxes in accordance with the law paid far more than those who had hidden their income and then simply declared it when the discounted offer was made.

Current Minister of Finance Cristóbal Montoro was cited as being responsible for the introduction of this unconstitutional offer although the government argued that this was a way of collecting additional income which it might never have received.

The court however considered that it would have been better to use the law to beat tax dodgers, rather than encourage them to benefit from their deception.

Losing mental capacity whilst living abroad

MANY UK expatriates living in Spain own properties in the UK and have pensions and investments in the UK. If you lose your mental capacity and do not have an LPA, then your family (or the authorities) will have no choice but to make an application to the Court of Protection to appoint a 'deputy' to look after your affairs, which can be time consuming and costly.

Will my LPA be recognised in Spain?

Unfortunately there is no international type of LPA which is guaranteed to work in both the UK and Spain.



He went on to shoot more of the Spaghetti Western films with Clint Eastwood in the area including ‘A Fistful of Dollars’ and ‘The Good, the Bad and the Ugly.’

It was also featured in ‘Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade’ and more recently, in 2012, the Doctor Who episode ‘A Town Called Mercy’ was filmed in the area.

As a result, hundreds of celebrities have left their footprints in Tabernas as it soon became known as the ‘mini-Holly-



wood’ throughout the 1960s and 1970s.

The Provincial Government of Almeria has now published an online guide to some of the movie locations so you can walk in the same footsteps. There is also Fort Bravo, a Western town that was predominately built for ‘The Good, the Bad and the Ugly’ and today it remains in almost its original condition. In 1977 the set was bought by a stuntman and in the early 1980s he started charging visitors to view and tour the set. Western Leone is the smallest of the three such parks and was originally built to film Sergio Leone’s ‘Once Upon a Time in the West.’



roles in the films *Vanilla Sky*, *All the Pretty Horses*, *Captain Corelli's Mandolin* and *Blow*.



Avocado exports on the rise

SPAIN is fast becoming a success story when it comes to the production and exportation of avocados. Fifty million kilos of the fruit are harvested each year and the sector is worth over €200 million.

The main growers are situated in the heart of Axarquía in Velez-Málaga, an area known for its microclimate and tropical produce.

The harvesting of the avocados is a little curious. Once the fruit has ripened, it can remain on the tree for up to six months before it is plucked. In Spanish crops, this tends to happen between December and May and TROPS, the company behind it all, claim that customer loyalty is high and demand is increasing.

TROPS export to 25 different countries, mainly in Europe, commanding a 15 to 20 per cent increase in value compared to avocados which come onto the continent

from South America. This is down to detriment caused by the time taken to transport from the likes of Mexico and Peru, making Spanish avocados the tastier option for the consumer.

Taking advantage of recent political tensions, TROPS are now considering expanding their reach even further with more business in the United States. The main supplier of avocados to the US is Mexico, which exports and supplies them with 700 million kilos of the fruit, but the rocky relationship between the two countries' presidents could leave a small gap in the market.

With Americans consuming a whopping one billion avocados per year, demand is high and unwavering and for the Spanish, this could be an incredibly lucrative market to crack.



Many people who are now household names and top of their fields struggled to get where they are today with many starting on a totally different path...

■ Oprah Winfrey

The American talk show host, actress, producer, and philanthropist had a rocky start to life. She was brought up in a low-income family and admitted once she was sexually abused. She became pregnant at the age of 14 but lost the baby and went to live with her father.

She was fired from her first job on a local television station, but has since gone on to become one of the most popular, influential and wealthiest women in media with television shows and even her own TV channel.

In 2013, she was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom by President Barack Obama. Forbes state her net worth as around \$2.9 billion (€2.7 billion).

■ J K Rowling

The woman behind the most famous wizard of all time, Harry Potter, has said she believed she was a failure before penning the novels.

She was a single, divorced mother suffering from depression and struggling to make ends meet in Edinburgh. In 1995 all major publishers rejected the Harry Potter script. But a year later a small publishing house, Bloomsbury, accepted it and in 1997, the book was published but with only 1,000 copies. Today, Harry Potter is a multi-million franchise with books, films and even a West End show and J K Rowling is now considered to be the most successful female author in the UK. Her net worth is said to be

around \$1.1 billion (€1.02 billion).

■ Henry Ford

Known for setting up the Ford Motor Company, one of the most successful automotive companies of all time, Ford is known to have failed twice before. His first foray into the motor industry was at the age of 36 with his first company, the Detroit Automobile Company.

That company went bankrupt. His second attempt was in 1901, when he formed the Henry Ford Company, which he ended up leaving with the rights to his name. It was with his third try, with the Ford Motor Company, that finally became the success we all know today as he revolutionised the car industry. Ford died in 1947 but is reported that in today's money, he would be worth around \$200 billion (€187 billion).

■ Sir James Dyson

The Dyson is known around the world as the vacuum that doesn't lose suction, but it took the creator, James Dyson, years to finalise and invent the system using the concept of cyclonic separation. He wanted to create the world's first bag-less vacuum cleaner and it took over 5,000 failures to get it right. When he did, no UK distributor would take on the product so he hit the Japanese market and three years later he got his first US patent for it. However, he still struggled with manufacturers so Dyson formed his own company in 1993 to market the product. His net worth is reported to be \$4.2 billion (€3.9 billion) according to Forbes.

LEGALLY SPEAKING

With or without a licence?

AS part of a new series, we answer some common driving questions, kindly provided by members of the Guardia Civil based in Torrevieja, Costa Blanca, who set up the N332 website and Facebook page to help break down barriers.



A REGULAR question that occurs is 'can I drive a small microcar' without a licence?

According to the N332 Guardia Civil team, many people say you can drive them without a licence because you don't need to have a Category B licence which is for cars. However, to say you don't need any licence is not correct as you must have a Category AM licence which is the category required to be able to ride a moped.

Because these 'microcars' have such a small engine, they are classed as mopeds and can even be driven by teenagers as long as they have the Category AM licence. However it must be noted that these vehicles must be driven on the hard shoulder where there is one, or as far to the right as possible, and they are not permitted on motorways.

The vehicle itself must be registered and insurance is still needed. It follows the same requirements as normal cars and it must have a logbook and ITV inspections must be carried out.

To obtain a Category AM licence your local driving school will be able to give you all the information you need, including requirements for a medical report if necessary.

So drivers should be reminded that yes they do need a licence for a vehicle and to drive any vehicle without a licence is breaking the law. Similarly, if you don't have your licence with you when you are driving it can be assumed you are driving without one until proven otherwise and you may be arrested until you can prove you are qualified to drive.

A. You have tripled your money in two years, turning a profit of €200,000.

It seems you will have to pay the full rate of Spanish capital gains tax, at 23 per cent of your profit, for a hefty tax of €46,000.

1. If you have tax returns for the previous three years.

2. And if you have held your principal residence for three years.

3. And if you use all your profits to buy a new principal residence in Spain, you would be free of capital gains tax.

An exclusive interview

Today Michel Euesden, Managing Director went along to Oakland Furniture to meet and interview Steve Day, Managing Director of Oak Land Furniture Spain.

The Euro Weekly News were delighted to be able to get the interview as Steve is not well-known to hold them and doesn't like the limelight, so it was certainly an exclusive scoop for the coast's number one expat newspaper.

■ **MICHEL:**

Well Steve, here we are at your San Pedro store and I must say it looks magnificent with such a large choice not only of solid oak furniture but also wonderful sofas too. Firstly I would like to say thank you for allowing us this interview as I understand you don't like publicity and interviews. May I firstly ask as it's intriguing why is that?

■ **STEVE:**

Ha ha, straight to the point as always Michel, wouldn't expect any more from you, but that's why I enjoy my team working alongside the EWN Media Group as it does exactly what it says it's going to do. You have a fantastic group of newspapers here in Spain.

■ **MICHEL:**

Thanks for the compliment Steve but you haven't answered my question and this is only my first one!

■ **STEVE:**

I guess I'm quite a shy person deep down but it's more than that, the business is not about me, it's all about the furniture and my great team of employees, without both of those the business wouldn't achieve what it does. I often wish wardrobes could talk as they and other items are the real success of the business!

At the end of the day if you haven't got a quality product then there's no longevity to your business, rather like your newspaper hey Michel! If you printed rubbish people wouldn't read your newspaper, but as we know you deliver a great read and that's why you have been on the coast for so many years! It's the same for my furniture, we deliver a full USP, 100 per cent solid oak throughout the product, building a product that will last the client a lifetime. It's not about me, it's about the furniture and so I like to sit in the background and allow the furniture to stand out and do the talking, customers can come in store and see the quality of the product and it stands out.

On the shop floor our ethos is the furniture sings out and the store staff just answer questions and explain procedures, we don't employ sales people in effect as the aim is to build the highest quality and designs that stands out.

■ **MICHEL:**

Steve, whilst we are not here to talk about my newspapers thank you again for the compliment, but yes we carry that same ethos within our business. Now can we stick to the questions without the swing back to me!

So obviously all this lovely furniture

in store, who designs it all and where does it actually come from?

■ **STEVE:**

Well as you can see the cuts of wood that we use to manufacture the furniture are of the highest quality, the wood itself comes North America from substantial forests complying with all strict EU timber regulations.

We use the highest grade which is North American white oak grade 1 on all the natural oak finished ranges. These are the cleanest cuts with the least knots if any and the most beautiful grains. With our rustic oak finishes we use grade 2 as we want the slight blemishes and knots to create the rustic look.

Anyway the logs are sent to our factories in both China and Vietnam where 90 per cent of the world's oak furniture is produced, the factories work to our designs and produce the furniture en masse to ensure the manufacturing process is economical to be able to offer our low retail prices. So for instance we do a production run of double wardrobes and then ship 40 foot sea containers to the warehouse in Swindon of double wardrobes, Swindon warehouse receives on a daily basis around 35-40 containers per day, every day six days a week.

The designs of our furniture are all exclusive to us and design protected and are all actually designed in-house by ourselves which I feel we are very good at, but this also saves huge designer fees to which again we pass on the savings to our customers.

Designer fees are very large in the industry we are in, so as we all have an eye for design we make some great savings.

■ **MICHEL:**

So Steve do you go to the Far East yourself to the factories and what's it like there if so?

■ **STEVE:**

In the early days of the business, the answer is yes, I probably spent 50 per cent of the year there, you had to as we had to train factories how we expected our furniture quality to be produced. I lived in Dalian which is north China, where the majority of factories are, as

well as Qingdao, China. Whilst huge it is strange as different products are manufactured in different regions, although we did get down to Shanghai and Beijing many times.

North China is beautiful and not how you would imagine, lovely coast line, great sea food and clean air! Over the last few years China has changed so much, I remember the first ever trip back in 2001 and as myself and my travel companion went down for breakfast we didn't like the look of the food as it was quite extreme to say the least, so we decided to stick with what looked hard boiled eggs, the waiter brought them over in a basket with a pair of chopsticks, we knocked the top off the egg to discover the chop sticks were for eating the chick!

Thankfully as the years have gone by and the country has become more modern, better food is now more available!

I don't go as much now as all the production is built up and as the business has grown Quality Control teams are now in place.

Vietnam we also use too, they have caught up with the supply market and chain and do a fantastic job as well. In fact in furniture making terms they are now more competitive and trips there are enjoyable, but again less frequent as QC teams on the ground.

Lovely places to visit but now I focus my main time here in Spain in the sunshine as we have a lot of work to do as we progress through Spain, Portugal and France.

■ **MICHEL:**

Yes Steve I saw on your website that delivery options are available to Portugal and France too, was that planned?

■ **STEVE:**

In truth no, it wasn't in the initial plans but when we launched in Spain some eight months ago now, lots of inquiries came in via the website requesting it and so we set up the delivery infrastructure to incorporate the ex-pats in those countries as well. No point turning away valued business!

■ **MICHEL:**

You haven't hung around there then Steve, so what was the initial plan and why Spain?

■ **STEVE:**

At my age I don't have time to hang around these days Michel! If I was as young as you maybe I would have more time!

■ **MICHEL:**

For someone who claims to be shy you are a bit of a charmer that's sure! Now back to the question why Spain?

■ **STEVE:**

Firstly I have always loved Spain and it was a good excuse to move here, but more importantly we could see the potential, we had customers on a weekly basis inquiring in the UK operation if we delivered to Spain. At the time we didn't and customers were paying a small fortune to ship the furniture over themselves. So clearly there was a market opportunity and a service to provide. Customers obviously know our

times, but I always believe there's room to improve. Everything is about the customer within our company. As we cover so many thousands of miles on delivery routes so our customers can enjoy the benefits of our furniture, we have to strive hard and we do with a great delivery infrastructure, as well as fantastic communication channels from the team to the customer.

■ **MICHEL:**

So Steve simple question, what's your biggest frustration?

■ **STEVE:**

Honestly, foot flow to the store, yes I know that the trading patterns are different here in Spain, but I still can't get my head around it totally, yes I get it's a modern world and people use the Internet and website, I get they know our quality product and brand but it still frustrates me, that's probably because I'm used to large store foot flows. The Store Manager Nik probably holds the largest conversion rate ever because everyone who comes to the store purchases in the main as they have already done their homework via the web. I guess I'm just an old-fashioned retailer but I will always find it strange that a customer will order say from Mijas on the web when the store's only 15 minutes away. I guess it doesn't really make any difference to us, but we do like to show off our fantastic products and showroom. Just a personal frustration really, just an age thing I guess!

■ **MICHEL:**

Okay that's your frustrations, but do you have a pet hate?

■ **STEVE:**

I try not to have them as it's never the end of the world, but there

are a few. Advertising reps calling the store phone number has always been one for 30-odd years now. The phone line is for our customers to inquire about furniture not a free tool for advertising reps who can't be bothered to call in store and show what they have to offer.

It does really wind me up this especially as the phone line could be engaged whilst a customer is trying to get through. I can't believe advertising reps can't see it's annoying and reduces their chances of obtaining business!

I have to say we don't get it too bad here as we have carefully selected our media partners like yourself Michel but it's a pet hate of many years. Calls have dropped in recent years but at the same time spam emails have gone up which are just as bad. I believe if you have something decent to offer go out and demonstrate and sell it.

■ **MICHEL:**

So with the showroom open in San Pedro, the website clearly fully operational and the delivery structure all in place with deliveries basically going out on a weekly basis across Europe to what appears rapid rate, what's next?

■ **STEVE:**

The first thing is always to both maintain and improve where possible standards and customer service. You have to establish a solid foundation to ensure when you do further expand you are ready for it and that it doesn't affect current business and customers.

We have though launched a website in full Spanish for the Spanish nation, we love Spanish people, their way of life and thank them for allowing us to bring our business to their country. At the same time I

hope they will enjoy and take advantage of our great product ranges and quality furniture. The website is www.oaklandmuebles.com.

We have employed recently the lovely Lola Lopez to work both at the showroom and operate the Spanish website. It's a very important project for me at present.

We also have as many customers know a superb choice of sofas at the finest low prices so we have also added www.sofastorespain.com.

■ **MICHEL:**

Another store Steve?

■ **STEVE:**

Yes for sure, the next one will be in the Costa Blanca somewhere in 2018 I would imagine, but it may change route dependent on how the Spanish website performs. Things never go to plan so it's a matter of how it all unfolds, maybe your readers could tell us if they want a store in Costa Blanca, if they do they can let me know by emailing info@oaklandfurniturespain.com.

■ **MICHEL:**

Steve it's been an absolute pleasure to meet you today and thank you so much for the interview. I know you don't like doing them so it's an honour for us at the *Euro Weekly News* to have one. Thanks again and I'll leave you to get on with your work as I see the email inbox on your computer is filling up. Thanks again Steve.

■ **STEVE:**

Never an issue for you Michel and thank you for the amazing services you provide to **Oak Land Furniture Spain**. Shall we go for a pint now? All this talking has made me thirsty in this heat!

product and brands so in realistic terms it made sense.

■ **MICHEL:**

Many people reading this could be thinking about starting a business here themselves, how did you find it to the UK and how different is it?

■ **STEVE:**

Patience is required for starters and a few deep breaths at times! Skin cancer awareness week

MORE than 250 dermatologists evaluated thousands of Spaniards across 49 provinces in a bid to detect and prevent skin cancer.

The initiative was part of the 2017 melanoma campaign organised by Spain's Academy of Dermatology and Venereology (AEDV), in which 33 other EU countries also participated.

According to AEDV, around 4,000 melanomas are diagnosed each year in Spain and believe around 80 per cent of these could have been avoided if adequate sun protection was used.

Cases are more common in those aged over 50, particularly as sun protection and the damaging sun's rays were less known about a few decades ago, but there are more and more cases of young people being diagnosed due to unhealthy habits of sun exposure.

However, the good news is that 80 per cent of melanomas are cured with surgery and early diagnosis means it is unlikely to

have spread to other parts of the body.

During the week-long campaign, specialists analysed moles and offered free consultations to check people's skin. Different activities were also arranged to remind people of the importance of protecting the skin from the sun's harmful rays and in checking moles for any changes. Remember if you have an existing mole that has changed shape, colour or size, you should get it checked.

Also, look for new moles, spots or lesions that are red, can bleed and are not healing.

Avoid sleeping beauty diet

EXPERTS are warning against the so-called 'sleeping beauty' diet.

The 'diet' advocates sleeping

as long as possible so there are less hours in the day to eat. Many women are also relying on sedatives and sleeping pills

to enable them to sleep up to 20 hours a day and are at risk of overdosing and becoming addictive.

The diet could also have an impact on the mental health of followers unable to interact or socialise, spending most of the day in bed leading to social isolation and potentially depression. It can also affect a person's body clock and dieters are more likely to binge eat when awake.

Experts warn sleeping pills should always be used with

caution. A study by Keele University found that as they can cause drowsiness and impaired balance, the risk of a fracture doubled in those who relied daily on sleeping pills to get to sleep. In 2015, a University of Washington study also showed a worrying link between sleeping tablets and dementia and researchers from Nottingham University in 2012 found that sleeping pills increase the risk of contracting, and dying from, pneumonia during their study.



Jellyfish stings

What happens if a jellyfish stings me?

The common symptoms of jellyfish stings, assuming the patient is not allergic or suffering from some type of illness which could worsen the effects, are: Pain, burning, inflammation and reddening and bleeding.

How do I treat a jellyfish sting?

When a jellyfish stings us, the pain and itchiness is immediate. The first thing that it is necessary to do is clean the area affected by the sting. We should never use freshwater, because it could break the stinging cells, causing another sting.

To clean the area, a saline solution is perfect. In case you don't have one, salt water could also be a solution. For approximately 15 minutes, you should apply cold to the affected zone.

If you use ice, don't apply the ice directly to the sting, but rather cover it with a cloth or a towel.

If any of the tentacle is still stuck to the skin,

remove it, but never with the hands. Use some kind of pinners.

You should also use some kind of antihistamine, for the reaction, and a painkiller for the pain. Pregnant women must pay special attention when taking antihistamines. If the pain is very intense, or the victim's condition worsens, they should seek medical attention immediately.

It's not necessary to rub yourself, either with towels or with sand; not with anything that could hurt you even more.

How can I avoid being stung by a jellyfish?

You should keep an eye out for the appearance of these animals on beaches or places where you regularly swim. You should never touch or handle jellyfish if you are not wearing appropriate protective gloves.

Limit yourself to looking at them from far away. They may be curious creatures, but you shouldn't forget that their stings can be dangerous.

The Passport must be processed through a veterinarian. It must be taken into account that, in a generalised way, travel is not allowed with animals under three months.

If you are one of those who likes the option of travelling by car, whether near or far, here are some tips to make the road more than comfortable to your most loyal friend:

1. Keep your pets safe and secure in a well-ventilated carrier. There are a variety of wire mesh, hard plastic and soft-sided carriers available. Whatever you choose, make sure it is large enough for your pet to stand, sit, lie down and turn around in. It would be good to get your pet used to the carrier in the comfort of your home before your trip. And please be sure to always

secure the crate so it won't slide or shift in the event of a quick stop.

2. Your pet's travel-feeding schedule should start with a light meal three to four hours prior to departure. Don't feed your pet in a moving vehicle - even if it is a long drive.

3. Never leave your animal alone in a parked vehicle. On a hot day, even with the windows open, a parked automobile can become a

furnace in no time, and heatstroke can develop. In cold weather, a car can act as a refrigerator, holding in the cold and causing the animal to freeze to death.

4. What's in your pet's travelling kit? In addition to travel papers, food, bowl, leash, a waste scoop, plastic bags, grooming supplies, medication and a pet first-aid kit, pack a favourite toy or pillow to give your pet a sense of familiarity.

5. Make sure your pet has a microchip for identification and wears a collar with a tag imprinted with your home address, as well as a temporary travel tag with your cell phone, destination phone number and any other relevant contact information.

6. Don't allow your pet to ride with his head outside the window. He could be injured by flying objects. And please keep him in the back seat in his crate or with a harness attached to a seat buckle.

7. Opt for bottled water or tap water stored in plastic bottles. Drinking water from an area he's not used to could result in tummy upset for your pet.

ONE OF THE MOST ANNOYING THINGS ABOUT BARS AND RESTAURANTS in this part of the world is attempting to get a Sherry.

If very lucky you may be offered a Tio Pepe, but apart from that you will get a Manzanilla!

And yet we are only a spittoon's distance from the home of Sherry. Jerez is a fabulous city and a visit to the Sherry houses is always worthwhile, as is the Real Escuela Andaluza del Arte Ecuestre (Royal Andalusian School of Equestrian Art) to see an incredible horse show.

I have loved Sherry since I was a kid. It was my Christmas treat even at the age of 10. Just like Mateus Rosé, Liebfraumilch, Blue Nun and Entre-Deux-Mers it was the sort of wine that 60's people drank... as long as it was Bristol Cream!

But to discover the delicate chalky overtones of a delicate Fino, like La Ina, or a rich Oloroso is worth the wait. I once held a dinner where I paired food with Sherry, starting with a great Fino with Oysters and finishing with a rich dessert with the fabulous Pedro Ximenez.

Though I could go on about the attributes of a great Sherry, instead I have asked my friend Rex Leyland, London restaurateur (ret'd) and Sherry aficionado to give me his perspective on the state of Sherry in Andalusia.

**BLUE WINE:
Unusual.**



SPANISH SHERRY: A visit to Jerez is worthwhile.

REX SAYS "I share Garry's annoyance that when I arrive in a restaurant in Andalusia and ask for a copita of Sherry all they offer is a glass of Manzanilla, which technically is not Sherry as it comes from Sanlúcar and not Jerez.* Sometimes they may also offer a glass of Fino, which is of course Sherry, but very dry.

I prefer the other slightly richer Sherries, like most English people, while the Spanish prefer Fino.

Jerez produces many varieties of Sherry that for me are much more exhilarating - namely Old Amontillado, Oloroso Seco, Palo Cortado and abocado, ligadillos, [both local Andalusian words], in common Spanish it is mitad mitad, which is a mix of normally dry and sweeter varieties. These are normally dispensed in front of you so that you can choose which balance of dry and sweet you prefer.

Why can't every restaurant stock the province's most famous wines. This beggar's belief. I can only assume that the Spanish have just lost appreciation of their own incredible invention.

This is so sad as the wines have so much to offer and can be enjoyed primarily as an aperitif, or drunk with various foods including ham, seafood, cheese, and of course for the English, all Sherries complement fine smoked salmon.

Sherry is robust enough to withstand many strong flavours which then, as with the sweeter varieties, allow them to be enjoyed as a digestif; as cream and old Oloroso, can accompany various puddings and cakes.

A good way to enjoy the sweeter wines is to prick plump sultanas or raisins and macerate for 24 hours allowing them to engorge the Sherry and serve with ice cream!

Sadly now, for aficionados, good Sherry has to be found in England as it is so difficult to obtain in Spain. The best stock of these great wines are in gentlemen's clubs in St James's in London.

Recently I was in a small bodega in Puerto Santa Maria called Bodegas Obregon where we were spoilt with locally produced varieties of Sherry including Muscatel and other sweet wines which were all mixed with dryer types.

Rosé, Red, White or BLUE?

THIS WEEK'S WINE CORNER is extremely unusual and a first in my case. I am familiar with blue tonic but this is the first time that I have encountered BLUE wine!! Baltar de Alort was given by a friend to try. I admit to having been a little hesitant, even though it looks pretty! Trying to find information about this

wine, however, has proven difficult. The Bodega, which is in Alcázar de San Juan (Ciudad Real) seems to specialise in sparkling wine. Nothing is mentioned about this 'still' version!

It has very little nose, because of its colour one cannot determine the freshness of colour, hue just to say... it's blue!! On the nose it has undercurrents of acetone (yes nail polish!) and little fruit. I did try two small glasses!! But was obviously not convinced.

Deals on meals

I WAS VERY SURPRISED when asked by a colleague to find a place to hold a lunch for 60- 80 people in Marbella that there is a shortage of premises/restaurateurs willing to hold such an event.

Having arranged many similar events across Spain as an organiser for Classic Car Clubs and the like, including such lunches in my own restaurants, I have normally been greeted with some enthusiasm.

It's true that the budget offered is normally well down on the average spend per head that many venues are used to achieving, but if you have a place that is empty on that day then to me it's fairly logical. Criteria are parking space, a large enough room to lunch and a quality, value for money menu.

Maybe Marbella restaurants are doing so well, they don't need the extra €2,500 such an event can bring in!!

A copa in this bar costs very little - perhaps a couple of Euro - with tapas to accompany. You can also take away any of the Sherries from the barrels for about 6€ a litre, but they charge an extra 1€ if they have to provide a bottle! For those who adore Spanish brandy as I do, they also produce their own, which is well worth sampling and of course it's for sale.

Finally there are other Spanish wines that 'pose' as Sherry namely Montilla and Chicalana, and although they seem to drink better when consumed in their respective town's bars, I prefer to avoid them elsewhere as they can never match the great wine called Sherry!"

**Manzanilla can technically be considered Sherry. It has a separate DO (denominación de origen) as it only comes from Sanlúcar, but is run by the same Consejo Regulador, in Jerez.*

ON THAT NOTE I will bid farewell until next week and should aspiring restaurateurs need some help or advice, please do contact me. A toast to Good Food, Good Wine and Good Friends.

Marca Macael off to conquer the US

A PLUSH event in New York City has introduced 'Marca Macael' (Macael Brand) to more than a dozen top North American companies.

The three-day promotional event began on Tuesday and finishes this evening.

The Spanish Ambassador to the United States, Pedro Morenes, attended the formal gala last night at the city's Metropolitan Museum of Art (MET), which is also showcasing a special promotional exhibition about the Almanzora Valley town.

The launch of Marca Macael is an ambitious project hoping to encourage top American architecture companies to invest in the town's biggest export - marble.

Macael is world famous for its marble and is capitalising from the global success of Cosentino, headquartered in Cantoria, which now has Cindy Craw-

ford as its Canada Ambassador.

A group of 11 Almerian companies with interest in Macael's marble are on a commercial mission to New York to establish partnerships with five architectural studios and another eight ma-

major design companies.

If they are successful Macael may someday soon be a household name in the US, with the brand gaining as much recognition as Cosentino's Silestone surfaces.

A shady business

ALBOX councillors are urging the town hall to install shaded areas in children's playgrounds. Popular Party spokesman Juan Perez Quiles said the parks are hardly used during summer days because of the exposure to intense heat.

He claimed the felling of trees in Plaza de Abastos showed a remarkable lack of foresight, done without taking into account the role they played in relieving residents of the harsh summer sun.

Trees should be planted and pergolas set up in the meantime he argues to encourage parents to spend more time with their children outside. Shaded parks would kill two birds with one stone, allowing children to play and getting adults a bit more exercise and family time walking them to the park.

Meanwhile, Perez Quiles has also suggested that children across Albox be given the option to attend a special summer school with support

from the council.

He proposes a summer school for all children in the municipality regardless of which school they regularly attend. It would be subsidised for poorer families and have a free canteen to feed students.

The spokesman says his party believes the summer school would help reconcile family and work life during the season. Many parents struggle to keep up regular working hours while looking after their children when the term time ends.

Previous summer schools haven't been as popular or inclusive as they might be because of the high costs for parents. A subsidised system would be best all round and also provide more employment for teachers.

The summer school would take a light-hearted approach to formal education, focusing instead on team building and problem solving exercises, sport and other skills.



Rising like a phoenix

THOUGH prices and sales are marching on to ever more impressive numbers, secondary industries associated with real estate are lagging behind.

Mortgages, appraisals, and construction industry expenses are much less active than they were a decade ago. So much so that the wider property market's activity is today gauged at a level estimated to be at around a fifth of 2004 activity.

The data from Euroval suggests that the real estate sector in its entirety is around 80 per cent smaller today than it was at the beginning of the housing boom.

The number of appraisals offers a striking example. There were 625,000 housing appraisals in 2016 compared to almost 1.4 million in 2006. Construction offers another insight. In 2008 there were 536,600 homes built compared to just over 50,000 last year. The number of permits issued for

new housing has plunged by 91 per cent since 2004.

Euroval's report shows just how deeply the real estate sector was tied in with Spain's greater economy when the recession struck a

decade ago. It also demonstrates the immensely important strides the housing market has made since then, as prices and sales transactions rapidly make up ground on a lost decade.



Jacaranda tree - is it friend or foe?

A JACARANDA tree in full flower is a spectacular sight to behold. Its almost iridescent mauve flowers brighten up streets and gardens all around the world and it is celebrated with festivals in many countries when in flower.

Spain is fortunate to have many Jacaranda trees as the climate here is almost ideal for them to thrive in coastal regions and frost free zones.

The flowers appear in late spring and early summer. A healthy tree will produce hundreds of bell-shaped flowers in conspicuous large groups or panicles that will cover the whole tree.

The fern like leaves are also very attractive. They create a softer environment and lighter shade which allows the flowers to be more dominant but add their own qualities of softness when the flowering season has finished.

“Pruning a Jacaranda spoils its natural shape and they don’t recover well.”

The tree generally grows slowly to a height of 20 metres over several decades in average soil but will grow faster in nutrient rich soil.

I have a tree that is 20 years old that I add no compost to now that it is established and has reached about 10 metres. This is an ideal size to appreciate the flowers but not have it take over the garden as its neighbouring mulberry tree attempts to do.

The Jacaranda require no pruning except to remove dead-

wood. Pruning a Jacaranda spoils its natural shape and they don’t recover well from pruning. Pruning also stimulates vertical growth of branches which is contrary to its natural horizontal form. It spoils the look of the tree to have vertical growths so it becomes a chore to have to keep removing them.

The difficulty of having a Jacaranda tree however is that it sheds material practically all year. Never plant one even remotely near a pool or over driveways, paths or any area that you do not want covered in plant debris. If you do, you will be constantly sweeping and cleaning the area of spent flowers, fern needles and seed pods.

This is where they become a foe.

They must only be planted where they can happily shed their plant material without spoiling anything else otherwise they become a menace. The Jacarandas’ shedding

characteristic can be an asset however as in the right place, such as an open field or the centre of a large garden bed or as a bordered feature on a lawn, the fallen flowers can look wonderful and provide a mulch around

the tree and for the garden.

So the answer to whether it will be a friend or foe depends on where you place it. For the Jacaranda to be a valuable asset to admire without the complication of constant clean up, place it in a position where it

can be a benefit to provide an abundance of mulching material for the garden away from built structures that can be adversely affected by its debris.

In this way you can enjoy one of the most beautiful flowering trees in the world.

Storing bits and bobs

to store them in, label and decorate them if necessary.


Another item that tends to get under our feet are shoes, but there are many ways of storing them, which include the use of a wine rack, buckets, pallets and even a plastic bottle.

Shady flowering shrubs

EVERYONE loves summer, but when temperatures are at their highest and the garden is lacking in the shade department, then it's all too easy to crawl back inside for some relief.

Adding shade to the garden with towering trees and shrubs can make the garden a more inviting prospect in the summer. It's useful to plant shrubs and flowers to cast shade on walkways and for maximum shade, choose plants that are one to three feet tall.

To keep patios cool and

shade specific areas, it's a good idea to plant trees that have dense foliage. Also, try using an arbor and train a vine round the structure, including a Chinese Wisteria that looks good, twisting and turning to a height of 30 to 50 feet. The flowers are on show in spring and they tend to droop down providing extra shade for the ground below.

It's also a good idea to plant taller shrubs around patios and garden beds, to ensure that both plants and people are protected from

the unrelenting heat.

The Rhododendron (Hydon Dawn) is one of the few plants that can withstand full sun. Its mature height is five feet, making it perfect shade next to a porch or other plants. An added bonus is that it displays large pink flowers in the spring.

There is no need to shade the outside area completely, but to have a good balance of sun and shade is ideal, which will keep sun-worshipping visitors happy.

Dog harnesses



HARNESS: Comes in three main types.

A DOG harness is piece of equipment for dogs, similar to harness tack for horses. There are various designs, depending on the type of use. Harnesses can be used on Seeing Eye dogs in assistance of a disabled person, on working dogs that haul a cart or sled, or even in sporting events, such as in the Scandinavian practice of ski-joring and pulka. Harnesses are also worn by non-working dogs for training purposes.

A harness is often worn in conjunction with a dog col-

lar and used as an alternative for a dog leash attachment. While a collar only encircles the neck, harnesses have a loop that surrounds the torso as well, with connecting straps between them for added reinforcement and control. The design allows for distribution of force which may prevent choking; a dog will also not be able to slip free from a harness as they may easily do from a standard collar. Harness use-

age is growing in popularity among many pet owners, especially for those with smaller breed dogs. Button-holes in pet clothes allowing access to harness straps are among recent adjustments to accommodate the increasing

use of harnesses.

Assistance dogs will sometimes wear a harness if part of their job requires guiding or providing physical mobility for a disabled person. Generally, the harness design includes a built-in handle for the person to grip; this type also offers reinforcement to the handler as well as a padded breast plate for the dog's comfort. Sturdiness of the design depends on whether the dog is gently leading, acting as a brace, or physically pulling a wheelchair.

Sled dog harnesses vary depending on the purpose of the animal; the two basic duties of a sled dog is hauling freight or some sort of racing. Harnesses come in three main types: the freight harness, the H-back harness, and the X-back harness. Dog

sports are growing and more types of harnesses are being developed, including the Y-back style and guard or distance harness.

The freight harness is often an H-back harness that forms a ladder-like effect across the back with a wide chest band and extra padding. The construction distributes the weight across the chest and over the shoulders because of the broad-

ness of the area; is designed to help the dog pull heavy weights efficiently.

The X-back harness gets its name from the straps that form an 'X' across the back of the dog. It is used more frequently than the H-back, with short versions that ride farther forward on the dog's body.

The Y-back is a hybrid somewhat similar in appearance to the H-back. The tug line attaches to the harness on top of the dog's back and stretches parallel to the ground or upwards to whatever is being hauled; the direction depends on what is being hauled.



TECH powerhouse Apple has announced a new iPhone feature which will block all notifications during driving. The Do Not Disturb While Driving option can detect whether users are at the wheel and how fast the car is travelling.

If it determines that you are in fact driving, it will block all phone calls, text messages and emails. Contacts will be told that you are driving through an answering machine mechanism or text replies.

If it's an emergency, contacts can use the word 'urgent' and the driver's phone will simply state that word to alert them.

The Do Not Disturb feature will be available on all recent iPhones which can handle the new iOS operating system being rolled out after summer.

Most powerful 911 ever

PORSCHE has released the most powerful 911 Turbo ever made. The Turbo S Exclusive Series went on sale in Germany last week and is scheduled for an extremely limited release of just 500 units worldwide.

Priced at roughly €260,000 the Coupe boasts 607hp with a 3.8 litre six-cylinder biturbo flat engine. It can reach 100kph from a standstill in just 2.9 seconds and is distinguished by a golden yellow metal paint finish. Top speed is 330kph.

Front seats adjust 18 different ways. The limited edition model naturally includes Porsche Dynamic Chassis Control, Porsche Active Suspension Management, and the Sport Chrono package.

The bonnet is carved from carbon fibre. Built entirely by an in-house team, it is the first Porsche to advertise the team's badge, Porsche Exclusive Manufaktur. The move has prompted speculation that the German brand is planning to wheel out regular exclusive edition models to cater to a growing luxury market.

Other colours are available, at a price. There are also 500 watch-

es. The smoothly named Porsche Design Chronograph 911 Turbo S Exclusive Series Watch costs a cool €10,000 and is forged from lightweight titanium. A bespoke luggage set is also on offer.

Opel Mokka X

THE Mokka X is a revised version of the Opel-Vauxhall Mokka crossover, and with smart looks, extra equipment and the option of four-wheel drive, it can take on the best in this fast-growing segment.

There is a wide range of petrol and diesel engines, with the 1.6 diesel a highlight, but so too is the 1.4 turbo-petrol engine which offers 0-100 kph in well under 10 seconds, yet can still return excellent fuel economy.

Mokka X prices start at €21,746 (£18,930) and entry level version is well-kitted with standard features such as cruise control, parking sensors, power windows and door mirrors, high beam assist, alloy wheels and a touchscreen infotainment system.

That list covers what most people want but up the range more and more equipment is added and my test model was in Elite trim and with auto gearbox, four-wheel drive and 1.4 litre petrol engine cost €30,282 (£26,360).

For this price you get too much to list but kit includes larger alloy wheels, roof rails, side mouldings,

leather heated sports seats and heated steering wheel, touch-screen and connectivity including Apple CarPlay and Android Auto, and Opel-Vauxhall OnStar which offers a range of driver aids. You also get climate and cruise controls, auto lights and wipers, front and rear parking sensors

The Mokka X has strong

visual road presence and displays a certain cachet which is important in a sector where kudos can sometimes outweigh common-sense. It also scores well for its practicality, surprisingly roomy inside thanks to clever design and with plenty of cabin storage for oddments. It can just about accommodate three adults in the rear with reasonable

comfort. The 356 litre boot is among the biggest in the class and can be increased to 1,372 litres by folding the rear seats, which drop flat easily.

The cabin has a quality appearance with attractive design touches, chrome detailing and well-ordered layout of controls and overall, the Mokka X interior is a pleasant place to be. Only quibble is with the oddly-designed handbrake release which is awkward to operate.

On the road, the 150 hp 1.4 litre turbo petrol engine is refined and quick, with a 0-100 kph time of 9.3 seconds and a top speed of 193 kph (120 mph). Fuel economy is 15.4 kpl (43.5 mpg). The controls are light and positive, giving assured handling and minimal body-pitch on the corners, and ride quality though firm is still comfortable.

Mokka X is right among the best in the compact crossover class, with impressive styling, good driving dynamics and plenty of standard equipment.

So much kit in fact that many buyers will find best-value at entry or mid-range levels.

Top 10 shake up



TESLA MODEL X: Waiting in wings for world domination.

AN intruder has broken into the ranks of the world's most valuable car companies. The new global top 10 now includes Tesla, the Silicon Valley insurgent with a tech billionaire CEO and laser focus on the emerging autonomous driving field.

Tesla's value rose by 32 per cent last year to reach \$5.9 billion. That makes it the eighth most valuable car brand on the planet, ahead of Land Rover and Porsche, on a 2017 Global Brands survey.

Elon Musk's company still has a lot of work to do before rivalling more established competitors at the business end of top 10. Despite registering a 3 per cent slump in 2016, Toyota is still the most valuable brand at \$28.7 billion, almost five times Tesla's value.

German duo BMW and Mercedes are in second and third spots at \$24.6 billion and \$23.5 billion respectively. Ford, Honda, Nissan and Audi make up fourth to seventh places.

Though nine members of the motoring top 10 would have been recognisable 30 years ago, industry experts believe quickly approaching changes will soon usher in a major shake up of the list.

Tesla is valued in the billions despite having only made 84,000 cars last year, contrasting with the 10 million produced by General Motors.

CRICKET

The first Champions Trophy semi-final between England and Sri Lanka or Pakistan took place yesterday in Cardiff while today's second 'semi' at Edgbaston features Bangladesh against India.

England won all three Group 'A' matches, knocking out Australia in the process in a rain affected game at Edgbaston. Ben Stokes hit a brilliant 102 not out to seal a 40 run victory via the DL method as England scored 240-4 (in 40.2 overs) opposed to Australia's 277 for 9 (off 50).

Mark Wood and Adil Rashid took four wickets apiece to restrict the Aussies to 5.54 runs per over.

India, meanwhile, thrashed South Africa by eight wickets in their last Group 'B' game.

A crowd of 24,500 will attend Saturday's final at The Oval.

MOTOR SPORT

Fernando Alonso - after his Indy 500 exploits - returned to F1 last Sunday in Montreal's Canadian Grand Prix which was won for the sixth time in 10 years by Lewis Hamilton, with Valtteri Bottas second and Danny Ricciardo third.

Presented with an Ayrton Senna helmets 24 hours before the race, Hamilton started on pole for a joint record 65th time and is now 12 points (141-129) behind championship leader Sebastian Vettel.

Italy's Andrea Dovizioso won last weekend's Catalunya MotoGP in Barcelona with Spain's duo of Marc Marquez and Dani Pedrosa second and third. Maverick

Vinales (111 points) leads the rider's Championship from Dovizioso (104) and Marquez (88).

Three British drivers, Ashley Sutton, Colin Turkington and Mat Jackson, all won races at the BTCC at Croft, North Yorkshire last Sunday.

And on June 17/18 we have the 85th Le Mans 24-hour race.

In the World Triathlon championships last weekend it was 'B' for Britain as Alastair Brownlee, his brother Jonny, Tom Bishop and Alan Bowden finished 1-2-3-4.
